

MIKE 'BUTCH' BUTCHER

1935 - 2004

t is with sad regret that we report the death of Mike Butcher. Butch joined the Abbots Langley Scout Group in 1948 at the age of thirteen, coming from another Scout Group. He sailed through Scouts, Senior Scouts and Rovers. After serving two years in the Parachute Regiment from 1955 to 56, having landed in the Suez Canal zone, he returned to Abbots, but then immediately immigrated to New Zealand. He stayed there for two years and obtained the rank of Scout Commissioner. He finally came home in 1960 together with four New Zealand Rover Scouts, who stayed and worked in Abbots for some considerable time.



At the close down of the Venture Scout Unit in Abbots in the 1970's, and with the help of two others, he started up a Sunday morning Adventure group for Scouts of age fifteen and above. This turned into a new Venture Unit for Abbots Langley.

Although never taking out a leader warrant, but being a member of the Rovers, and later the Scout Fellowship, he introduced caving to Abbots Langley. As a result the then Rover Crew became experts in this field and had some sway in instigating the cavers badge into Scouting. Later in 1976, Butch took over the canoe section, and with a lot of training and coursework, he became a British Canoe Union senior instructor. This fared well and was very useful not only for Abbots Langley, but also for the District.

Mike supported the Abbots Langley Scout Group for many years with fetes, jumble sales, markets etc, and was a member of the Group Executive Committee for about fifteen years. He organised two very successful Group Family Camps in

the latter years, but most of all Butch managed to hold together the younger element in Scouting, who are now the main support team of the Abbots Langley Scout Group.

In December 2003 he was awarded the Medal of Merit for 40 years service and dedication to the Scout Movement, and particularly this group.

2004 was another year of successful scouting in Abbots Langley. The Troop continues to remain full with 38 scouts, with places only offered to Cubs and siblings.

The Scouts participated in the County Green Beret and supported all the District events, providing the largest number of teams in all the District competitions. These events included a repeat victory in the Triathlon last May, participation in the new Cooking Competition in October, the Wide Game Competition in January, which was very well organised by our own Fellowship, and the Night Owls and Night Triffid Trophy in March. Well done and congratulations to all those that took part.
